“ Kenneth Arnold Kennamer, age 90, passed away Friday, January 27, 2017 at his home in the Swaengin community. He was a dedicated and loving husband, father, grandfather and great grandfather who enjoyed gardening, traveling and spending time with family.

Mr. Kennamer served the U.S. Army in the Pacific theater in World War II, returning home after the war to graduate from DAR High School. He later studied carpentry at the Alabama School of Trades in Gadsden. Like many struggling to find work in the post-war South, he briefly moved his family to Detroit where he worked for the Cadillac Motor Company. As soon as he was able, he returned to Marshall County and soon built a house on the property where he lived out the rest of his days.

Mr. Kennamer worked various jobs over the years, retiring from Southern Yarn in Albertville at the age of 62. He raised cattle for many years, giving them up just a few years ago; he raised a garden as recently as last year. He loved to build things, from toys for his children and furniture for his home to tractor implements and other farm needs. His life exemplified hard work, patriotism, faith, and dedication to family. He was a dedicated member of the Swaengin Church of Christ.

Survivors include his wife of 68 years, Mary “Billie” Kennamer. Children: Margaret (David) Cox of Grant, Wynell (Steve) Moore of Trussville, Randall (Amy – deceased) Kennamer of Grant, Donna (Tony) Morrison of Guntersville, and Dr. Michael (Trisha) Kennamer of Henagar, along with 13 grandchildren and 8 great grandchildren and a host of nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, Frank and Bessie Kennamer of Swaengin, his brothers and sisters, and his children: Kenneth Wayne Kennamer, Kathy D. Kennamer and Byron Lee Kennamer.
