Robert Glenn Davis, 90, of Guntersville, passed away peacefully surrounded by family at Shepherd's Cove Hospice on October 22, 2023. Bob was born on March 25, 1933, in Salem, West Virginia. He served in the US Navy during the Korean War and spent his career working in computer programming, retiring from Teledyne Brown in 1992. A devoted husband and father, he is survived by his wife of 66 years, Mary F. Davis, daughter, Janet Lauren Bernarde (Scott) and two sons Jeff Davis and Andy Davis (Lisa). His grandchildren are Kris Bernarde, Katelyn Bernarde, Landon Davis and Monroe Davis.
